David C. Niblack spent most of his professional life fighting the good fight in court here in the District of Columbia and in the Wisconsin Public Defender Service, which he led for several years. He taught young lawyers to do the same—first at Georgetown, then at Antioch Law School where he served as Clinic Director, and, until his death, here at UDC Law where he taught Trial Advocacy. A scholarship in his name is a great honor.
